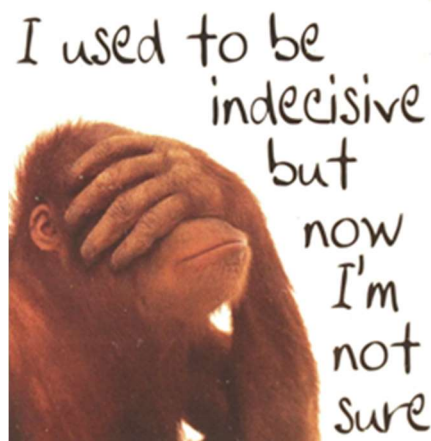
A ZOOM PRESENTATION, FOLLOWED BY Q&A SESSION

Making Your Mind Up Quickly by Ian Mitchell

Friday 29th January, at 10.00 a.m.

Ian Mitchell, until his recent retirement, was a senior lecturer in the Department of Psychology at the University of Birmingham. Prior to that he held a Wellcome lectureship in neuroanatomy at the Medical School of the University of Manchester. He has published research on Parkinson's disease, programmed cell death, social cognition and the neurobiology of psychopathy. He regularly gives public lectures on neurobiology and psychology at venues which include theatres, pubs and cruise ships.

In this talk he will explore the ways in which we make our minds up and look at how quickly we make decisions. He will propose that our decision making is a little paradoxical. Some seemingly trivial choices may take us a long time to make. Equally, some extremely important decisions, including who we partner and which politicians we vote for, may be taken in fractions of a second.
